Introduction:

The Vyakarana Department in the university was started in 1972. Great scholars like Mahamahopadyaya Prof. N.S.R Tatacharya, Mahamahopadyaya Prof. M. D. Bala Subrahmanyam, Mahamahopadyaya Prof. K.V. Ramakrishana-macharyulu, blessed the department. Mahamahopadyaya Prof. K.V. Ramakrishnamacharyulu, Professor of Vyakarana(Rtd), and former Vice Chancellor, JRRS University, Jaipur is a great scholar not only in the traditional way but also in modern thinking like Natural Language Processing. Under his guidance Vyakarana, Nyaya and Computer Departments, in collaboration started a new course M.A in Sabdabodha and Language Technology in 2004. The Vyakarana Department also handled Sanskrit-Hindi Machine Translation project of Ministry of Science and Technology, New Delhi with the collaboration with IIIT Hyderabad and Hyderabad Central Universities. The department successfully completed some modern outlook projects like e-text of Maha Bhasya, Ashtasdyayi etc, with Hyperlinks.

The Vyakarana department is handling a prestigious project of UGC and MHRD, named e- PG Pathasala Sanskrit (Acharya in Vyakarana) and is preparing 640 modules of 16 papers of PG course in 54 Quadrants of each module with the assistance of faculty members and country-wide outside experts. It is our ambition that the department of Vyakarana has to become model to other departments.

Department of Jyotisha

Introduction

Jyotisha is a very popular and useful subject in India. Jyotisha in India is closely connected with the day to day life of the common man. It is firmly believed that any ritual performed according to the direction, place and the time only yields expected result. These three can be determined only by the study of Jyotisha.

There are number of branches in this vast subject named Jyotisha. Astronomy and Astrology are among them. Even in the Vedic period there was significant progress in the field of Astronomy. Unfortunately exclusive works on astronomy of the Vedic period are not available to us.

Since Aryabhata's time (Sixth century onwards) the famous works on Astronomy and Mathematics of Varahamihira, Brahmagupta, Lalla, Sripati, Bhaskara are available to us. Most of these works consists of Arithmetic, Algebra, Spherical Trigonometry and Astronomy. Parallel to them, there are number of texts pertaining to predictive Astrology. After doing systematic study and research the authors of the texts might have come to various conclusions. It is needless to mention that the Modern Astronomy has been developed on the firm basis of traditional ancient Astronomy.

Not much study of the Ancient Indian Jyotisha has taken place. Therefore the main focus of the department is to teach the students these ancient texts and inspire them to undertake extensive research on the Subject. It is unfortunate that even the learned scholars of the country are still not aware of the valuable contributions of the ancient Indian Astronomers in the field of Astronomy and Mathematics.

Dr.Arkasomayaji was appointed as Reader in Hindu Astronomy in the department. He wrote English commentary to the SiddhantaSiromani of Bhaskara. This was published by the Vidyapeetha in 1972 and again in the year 2000. Dr.Arkasomayaji won the President Award in 1974. Dr. M.A. Bhata started Acharya and Shastri courses in Jyotisha and Prof. R.K. Thakur joined the department in the year 1987 and he has won KendriyaSahitya Academy award in 2013. Prof. A. Sripada Bhat joined the department in the year 1993 and he is one of the members of Sanskrit Science Exhibition committee of the Vidyapeetha and has visited many Universities of India. Prof. V. UnnikrishnanNampiyathiri joined the department in the year 1997 and Dr.Krishneshwar Jha in the year 2004. Mr. Lavakumar joined the department in the year 2010. Guest Lectures have been appointed time to time based on requirement of the department.

Conferences, Workshops, Seminars, extension Lectures are conducted in the department to enrich the experience of students as well as that of the staff. The teachers of the department are actively involved in the research. Apart from regular courses certificate course has also been offered in evenings for which good response has been received.

Phil. and the Ph.D. Scholars are encouraged to pursue editing and publishing of unpublished manuscripts for their dissertations. This activity generates new aspects of basic knowledge related to the discipline of Jyotisha.

Five major strengths:

1. The on-going research activities of the department are relevant to the contemporary society.
2. The teachers of the department are well versed in the subject with National and International reputation.

Five major weaknesses:

5. The department requires a planetarium

Five major opportunities:

1. The department has got enormous scope for conducting inter-disciplinary/Multi-disciplinary research in collaboration with the reputed Scientific organisations in the country.
2. Students of the department have good opportunity of earning for themselves
3. Sufficient returns with minimum investment.
4. Enormous people support.
5. Availability of modern facilities like internet and expertise in the teaching faculty.

7. More number of collaboration and linkages with various organisations for generation of more funds and promotion of research.

Introduction to the Department

The word “Veda” means knowledge. The Vedas are honoured as the oldest literature by Indians as well as the whole world. The Vedas are regarded as repositories of all knowledge and of ancient Indian wisdom. In the hierarchy of literature the Vedas are the first to be revealed, the other being evolved from them. Vedic literature is vast treasure and relates to almost all aspects of life. It is the real source of data which is expressed in other branches of classical literature. The Vedas are related to different branches of sciences. There are description of laws of nature, the origin of the Universe and the place of man in it. Vedabhashya elaborates and explains ideas contained in the hymns. As mantras are incomprehensible so Bhashya or commentary is introduced to make mantras understandable. Though Vedic hymns are important, if the Vedas are studied without understanding their meaning it is not considered to be beneficial. In this context Yaskacharya has given in his opinion in Nirukta that “yoarthagnya itsakalam bhadramashnute” that means “he who knows the meaning of the mantras is the real introducer of the Vedas and also knows the subject matter of the Vedas.” So meanings of the hymns also should be known. There is description of the process of performing the Vedic rituals and the Divine sacrifices, which is most essential for the smooth conduct of human life.

The Department of Vedabhasya was established in the year 2003. The process of teaching adopted in the department is based on the ancient teacher - disciple tradition. The Department of Vedabhashya studies the Vedic text as well as its commentary.

The existing subject of “Archakatva and Pourohitya” introduced in 1994 was assigned to this department. This, being a type of vocational subject paves way to more employability.

Rashtriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha is first Sanskrit University to introduce Computer Science and Applications as one of the main subjects in undergraduate level. The Department of Computer Science was sanctioned by U.G.C and started its functioning in the year 1996. The Computer Centre was inaugurated by Sri J.B. Patnaik, former Chief Minister of Orissa on 16th December 1996.

The main objectives of the Department of Computer Science Department are

- To utilize knowledge in Sanskrit literature for developing Knowledge systems.
- To build bridge between Sanskrit Language and IT.
- To develop Computer Application programs related to Sanskrit Learning system

The Vidyapeetha initiated the department of Mathematics together with computer science with Prak - Sastry which is equivalent to Intermediate / +2 level course. Rashtriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha is the first Sanskrit university to introduce Mathematics together with computer science as main subject in Prak- Sastri and subsequently introduced Mathematics at Undergraduate level . The department of Mathematics was sanctioned by UGC and started its functioning in the year 1996.

Dwaita Vedanta is a one of the famous philosophies in Indian Philosophy, introduced by the Sriman Madhwacharya. The philosophy has 37 sarvamoola Granthas written by the Sriman Madhwacharya. This Philosophy discusses the Sutra Prasthanas, Upanishad Prasthanas, Gita Prasthanas, Purana Prasthanas, Tantra Sara and Itihasa and others.

All the sarvamoola granthas have commentaries. These commentaries were written by Sri Jayateerthacharya (Tikakrutpada). All these commentaries once again have sub-commentaries written by Vyasateertha, Vadirajateertha, Vijayeendratirtha, Raghottamateertha, Sri Raghavendra Teertha's etc. In this way the Dwaita Vedanta philosophy was developed.

This Major Philosophy was introduced for study by the Rashtriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha, Tirupati in the year 1998. After that Sastri, Acharya, M.Phil and Ph.D classes showing good development.

Within 15 years 14 students were awarded Ph. D in Dwaita Vedanta department and currently 18 members are doing Ph. D in the department. Sixteen students have completed M. Phil.

Dwaita Vedanta department is developing a Dwaita Vedanta Vishwa kosha [Dictionary], a project sanctioned by the University Grants Commission and completed up to ३१

There are two kinds of Darshanas, i.e. Astika Darshana & Nastika Darshana. Astika Darshana is that which acknowledges the Vedas as Pramana. That which does not admit the Vedas as Pramana is called Nastika Darshana. Except for the Buddhists, Jains, Charvakas all Indian Darshanas are Astika Darshanas. Mimamsa is one of the popular Darshanas among all Darshanas. Mimamsa Nyayas are used not only in Darshanas but also in other areas like Sahitya, etc. and have been applied by Sri Appayadikshita and others. Even in Indian Judiciary Mimamsa Nyayas are used to deliver judgments.

The theories embedded in Mimamsa are very helpful to all the Darsanas like Vedabhashya, Dharmasastra Vedanta etc. Because of the extensive use of Mimamsa darshana in understanding other areas of knowledge, it was felt that students should learn Mimamsa. Accordingly the Department of Mimamsa was started in the Vidyapeetha in 2006. Many distinguished scholars like Mahamahopadhyaya N.S.R Tatacharya, Prof. Suryanarayana Bhat, Prof. Srirama Sharma, Prof. K.E. Devanathan visited and delivered lectures for the benefit of the students. As there is great demand regarding Yagas, the department has always been engaged in training students, public by conducting theoretical and practical classes with reference to Mimamsa Philosophy.

A Masters degree in Sabdabodha Systems and Computational Linguistics was sanctioned by the University Grants Commission under the innovative program scheme for a period of 5 years starting from the year 2004. The Course being an interdisciplinary one in nature, offered the best of both worlds to the students .i.e. the traditional sastric teaching methods and the modern computational methods. The chief aim of the course was to unearth ancient techniques embedded in the Sastric texts and use them in the context of current linguistic theories , thereby creating a universal translator among Indian languages and reduce the language barrier to a great extent. The Departments of Computer Science, Vyakarana and Nyaya worked in tandem and shared the workload to ensure the smooth running of the course in its early stages. Currently the Department has an Assistant Professor who shoulders the responsibility of all the departmental works.

Ever since the start of the innovative PG programme in Sabdabodha Systems and Computational Linguistics, the department has been striving hard in generating new knowledge. The project work done by the students in the 4th semester under the guidance of the faculty over the past few years has resulted in the development of various parsing, sandhi-splitters, vruttha identifying tools and so on to name a few.

Apart from this, various theories pertaining to verbal cognition with respect to Nyaya, Vyakarana and other Sastras, are taught to the students and great effort is put in to unearth theories which could be helping in areas of translation.

Five Major Weaknesses:

1. Very Limited Faculty.

3. Very less student strength due to extreme shortage of career opportunities.
4. Proper awareness about this interdisciplinary course lacks.
5. Being an Interdisciplinary and emerging course, there is severe shortage of subject experts.

2. Extracting various techniques in the Sastric Lore with respect to Sabdabodha (Verbal Cognition)

Introduction:

Extensive globalization is making the world into a village consequently making learning of English a necessity. Rashtriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha which is always in the forefront of adapting to the ever-changing needs of Sanskrit learners with a lot of foresight had started English as one of the compulsory papers in Prak-Sastri and Sastri level in 1969. The courses that were taught included General English Course for Prak- Sastri and Sastri as well as Optional English Literature paper for Sastri programme. Then, English formed one of the units under the Faculty of Sahitya and Samskriti. Dr. M. Sarada was the first lecturer appointed in English. Dr. V. Sujatha joined the department in the year 1982. Dr. R. Deepta joined the department in the year 1999 in the vacancy created by Dr. M. Sarada's Voluntary Retirement in 1998. The English Unit is upgraded to a Department in 2008. Dr. V. Sujatha headed the Department from 2009 – 13. Dr. R. Deepta is the heading the department currently.

In addition to the above mentioned courses the Department of English has introduced Certificate Course in Functional English in 2003-04, Bridge Course for Shastri Veda Bhashyam I year in 2002 – 03. When Choice Based Credit System was introduced in the Vidyapeetha, the Department of English offered English as one of the soft core subjects for Acharya from 2012. Under it, the department offers comparative literature, linguistics, comparative Aesthetics and Translation.

The material for these crash courses has been prepared with the help of External experts, though the classes were taken by the faculty in the department.

2. The Department runs a Club “Maxmuller English Club” which meets every Saturday. The Club has been started with an objective of improving the speaking skills of Sanskrit students in English along with developing organizational skills and ability to work as a team. Students are encouraged to participate in activities which help them in speaking in English. Activities such as elocution, debate, vocabulary games, quiz, role play, group discussion are conducted. Prizes are distributed to the winners of these weekly competitions at the end of each academic year.

3. The students also attend other enrichment programmes organised in the Vidyapeetha like Pattabhirama Sastri Vykhyanamala, Lectures on Personality development organised by Career Counselling Cell etc.

Sastri Level literature: Drama/ parts of the novel are made to enact in addition to discussing it in the class. Visual aids such as films based on literary work are also used. Group work is given to discuss the different aspects of the literary works or literary terms and movements. Regular library work is given for the students to develop skills in researching.

The Department has designed a Bridge Course exclusively for the Veda Bhashyam students of Shastri I who have no or little English learning. This course enables them to grasp essential skills in English and acquire a certain competence in English so that they can be on par with other students when they move to II year.

The faculty in the department through their individual research has brought in new knowledge

1. Developed Reading Cards in English exclusively for Sanskrit Students
2. Applied recent theory of Narratology to Sanskrit Classical works like Panchatantra & Mahabharata
3. Analysed novels from the perspective of Critical theory of Eco-criticism
4. Established the fact that many Indian Novels in English in recent years carry not only Sanskrit mythical elements as themes and motifs but also use the narrative techniques of Sanskrit classics.

51. Detail five major strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and challenges (SWOC) of the department.

Five Major Strengths:

1. Dedicated permanent teaching staff
2. The teaching staff in the department are involved in helping the students outside the class room.
3. Diversified interests of different faculty members enable the department to represent holistic approach to the English Studies.
4. The curriculum allows for students' involvement in practising language skills in real life situations.
5. Unlike the other Sanskrit Institutions, English Department in the Vidyapeetha has always had support of its administration.

Five Major Weaknesses:

1. Less than ideal opportunity for the student to interact because of difference in student – teacher ratio especially in compulsory English courses.



2. As the students come from heterogeneous background, entry level of one student to another varies quite sharply, bringing obstacles in teaching-learning process.
3. No opportunity in the institution for the staff to guide students for Research.
4. Less opportunity for the faculty to concentrate on research outside the institution because of heavy work load.
5. Need for more teaching posts for the department to cope with workload.

Five Major Opportunities:

1. Being an English Department in a Sanskrit Institution, the Department has opportunities for comparative studies in collaboration with other departments.
2. As the students come from different parts of India, the opportunity to meet and teach students of heterogeneous background.
3. The department can be the much needed link to the ancient Sanskrit lore and requirements of modern age.
4. The department has lot of opportunities to do translation from Sanskrit to English and vice-versa.
5. The department has a good opportunity to develop research in language and linguistics.

Five Major Challenges:

1. To continue to teach in an interactive and communicate method allowing all the students to develop LSRW skills in English, in spite of the difference in teacher – student ratio.
2. To teach for students of different entry levels in English in the same class and bring improvement in all of them according to their level.
3. To prepare syllabi in language and literature papers when the target group is Sanskrit learners with less or almost no exposure to English.
4. To continue to involve in research activities in spite of not having any opportunity to guide students.
5. To continue to do research activity in spite of the busy teaching schedule.

- The Department would like to start a centre for comparative studies
- The Department also proposes to start full-fledged Masters Programme in Comparative Studies.
- In course of time it also wishes to have M. Phil and Ph. D courses.
- The department would like to develop a more effective teaching methodology involving ICT to cater to heterogeneous group of students with different entry levels and different regional backgrounds.

The Vidyapeetha being a national level Institution and admitted students from all over the country, Telugu was introduced as one of the options under language part to the students of Sastri, BA, B. Sc and also Prak-Sastri programmes. Taking into consideration the increase of student strength during the last Decade, Telugu Literature were offered as optional for students. The authorities of Vidyapeetha considered the increased Teaching work load for Telugu and strengthened the Department by sanctioning one additional post of Lecturer / Asst. Professor. The same post was filled in the year November, 2009. Accordingly the Department has now two Asst. Professors.

Under the department Annamacharya Sahitya Kalaparishad has been initiated in the year 2011, to encourage the students through essay writing elocution and other types of competitive events conducted on relevant occasions .

The Telugu department caters to the needs of the local students who join the Vidyapeetha for Sanskrit studies.

Hindi as a subject of teaching was introduced in the Vidyapeetha way back in 1969. Hindi was then offered as an option in second language in Prak-Sastri level and Sastri level. It was also an option in 2nd and 3rd elective in sastri level. Till 2004 these papers were dealt by guest faculty. In 2004 Dr. Karan Singh Uttwal was appointed as Assistant Professor of Hindi and when he left the Vidyapeetha to join Maulana Urdu University, Hyderabad, Dr. Ganesh Pawar was appointed in his place. Dr. Latha Mangesh joined the faculty in 2012. Dr. Ganesh Pawar went on lien to Gulbarga University, Karnataka in 2012. Hindi which was a unit under the faculty of Sahitya & Samskriti was made an independent department in 2008. The Hindi department looks after the Raja Bhasha cell and its activities.

M.A. in Hindi was sanctioned to the department in 2013-14 as part of Rajabhasha cell. Hindi is also offered as a soft-core option for Acharya now. Department of Research & Publications

Introduction:

The Department of Research & Publications was one of the earliest departments established in the Vidyapeetha in 1962 [along with Department of Pedagogy = educational training] on the recommendations of the Sanskrit Commission 1956-57 Govt. of India. The Report of the Commission says - *“that the Sanskrit University or Universities recommended by this Commission should have Research Department devoted to the different Shastras where Pandits might be able to make their original contributions”* (Page no. 178 – Report of the Sanskrit Commission). The Department is under the Faculty of Sahitya & Samskruti and actively contributes to the fulfillment of the objectives of the University in various aspects and also to the betterment of Sanskrit higher studies through Research & Publications. The department has five teachers and one Research Assistant. Apart from publication activity the Department is running a unique program ‘M. Phil’ in Manuscriptology and Paleography. In addition to this, the department also brings “Mahasvini” ISSN numbered, peer reviewed Sanskrit Research Journal.

In association with scholars of Vidyapeetha and also with the scholars of other institutes, the department brought out 292 publications on behalf of Vidyapeetha.

It has trained nearly 230 Research scholars in reading the ancient scripts such as Grantha, Sarada, Nandi Nagari etc. in 10 years and prevailed upon them to undertake Sanskrit research based on manuscripts.

Objectives of the Department:

- to publish literature and develop print and non-print materials in and about Sanskrit including original texts, commentaries and translations ;
- to collect, preserve and publish manuscripts and to provide means for training in Manuscriptology specifically in scripts used for Sanskrit manuscripts ;
- to establish relevance of Shastras to the problems in modern context ;
- to provide facilities for the study of such languages and literatures of Asia that have a bearing on Sanskrit studies such as Pali, Mongolian, Japanese etc. ;
- to provide means for education in modern disciplines needed for meaningful interpretation of original Sanskrit texts including literature in Sanskrit.



International Reputation for the publications of the Department :

In 1964, with the ambitious project to compile Agama Kosa, the Department of Research & Publications was born in the Vidyapeetha and gradually it took up the publications of rare and valuable works in other fields.

The books on the Vedas edited by Dr. B.R. Sharma have won the appreciation of the scholars from all over the world. The publication brought by the department has been recognized by reputed institutions and awards have been conferred on the writers/authors of the books. Prof. N.S. Ramanuja Tatacharya who once served in the department , later became the first Vice-Chancellor of the Vidyapeetha had been awarded “Shri Vani Alankarana” by Dalmia Trust for his book ‘Pratyaksha Tattvachintamani Vimarsha’. Prof. Harekrishna Satapathy, Vice-Chancellor of R.S.Vidyapeetha also was awarded “Shri Vani Alankarana” by Dalmia Trust for his poetry- Mahakavya ‘Bharatayana’ and Prof. Radhakanta Thakur, Dean, Academic Affairs of the Vidyapeetha won “Kendriya Sahitya Academy” for his poetry ‘Caladuravani’ - book publications brought out by the department.

Thus, the dept is playing a key role, significantly contributing to the research and publications activity.

Further, the faculty members are co-ordinating various Research Projects, the outcome of which contributes to generate new knowledge, both at basic and applied levels.

Department of Education

Introduction

The Department of Education, was established in the year 1962 with sole aim to impart Training to Sanskrit teacher aspirants on recommendations of Central Sanskrit Commission and the first course started by the Vidyapeetha was Shiksha–Sastri (B.Ed.) and later the department started Shiksha Acharya (M.Ed.) course from the Academic year 1983-84; M.Phil (Education) from the Academic year 2004-05, and also Vidyavaridhi (Ph.D.). Recently it started Vidyavaridhi course work of six months for newly admitted Research scholars in the Department. Considering the qualitative academic records of the Vidyapeetha, the government of India has sanctioned Institute of Advanced study in Education (IASE) in the year 1997.

Institute of Advanced Study in Education (IASE) (Accredited at ‘A’Level by NAAC (2003-2008))

The Rashtriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha, Tirupati was established mainly to develop a new pedagogy, a hybrid of modern methods of language teaching and traditional methods of teaching of Sanskrit and to provide pre-service teacher training for secondary school teachers. The Institute of Advanced Study in Education (IASE) was established for the qualitative improvement in the areas of teacher training, i.e. 1. Pre-service, 2.In-service, and 3.Research & Extension Services for the upliftment and updating the Sanskrit Pedagogy.

MHRD Scheme, for publishing books on education in Sanskrit Medium.

UGC Special Assistance Programme (DRS I) from 2009 – 2014

The UGC has sanctioned Rs.29.50 lakhs plus two Project Fellows to the Department of Education of the Vidyapeetha under its Special Assistance Programme (SAP). The Department of Education was selected for sanction of the SAP on the basis of its work, academic achievement and viable potential for further development. The essence and primary aim of this UGC scheme is a combination of teaching and research to encourage group research efforts in pursuit of excellence. The special assistance for the Department of Education



is for a period of five years. The thrust area of Education identified under this programme is “**Language Development and Material Production**”

UGC Special Assistance Programme (DRS II) from 2015 – 2020

The UGC has sanctioned Rs.97.50 lakhs to the Department of Education of the Vidyapeetha under its Special Assistance Programme (SAP) DRS II. The Department of Education of the Vidyapeetha was selected for sanction of the SAP on the basis of its work, academic achievement and viable potential for further development. The essence and primary aim of this UGC scheme is a combination of teaching and research to encourage group research efforts in pursuit of excellence. The special assistance for the Department of Education is for a period of five years. The thrust area of Education identified under this programme is “**Philosophy of Education**”.

Organisation of Seminar / Workshop and Training Programme

The Department of Education conducts regular Seminars, workshops in every academic year. Some of the main Seminars highly appreciated by the teacher training fraternity are on topics such as –

1. Evaluation techniques.
2. Sanskrit Teaching Methodology.
3. Problems of Sanskrit Teaching.
4. Language Teaching.
5. Teaching Practice and Lesson Plan.
6. Quality Improvement in Teacher Education.

Faculty improvement programmes are also conducted regularly which enables the faculty of Education to update their knowledge. One such programme was the programme on information and communication technology (ICT) in the year 2008. The members of faculty were highly benefited by this programme.

Physical Education :

The Department of Physical Education was established on 10th February, 1996. The Department imparts training in Sports and Games.

The Vidyapeetha considers Sports and Games to be an integral part of the curriculum and several activities are being conducted throughout the year to promote and propagate physical education among the students. The students of the Vidyapeetha are trained in different Sports and Games by Qualified and well trained Sports Instructors. Students take part in South Zone Inter University Tournaments and All India Inter University Tournaments. The Indoor Stadium is also available, the students selected for tournaments undergo circuit training in multi- gym and other gym items as required for a specific game. A separate multi-gym is also established in ladies hostel for the benefit of girls.

The UGC in XII plan(2012-2017), has sanctioned Rs. 1.3 Crores for the Development of Sports Infrastructure and Equipment in University.

A proposal has been submitted for Centre of Excellence for Development of Sports (CEDS) Under XII Five Year Plan (2012-2017) Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India.

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
